


Kempton Steam creates a 'roaring' success



Kempton Steam Museum in West London hosts an exciting new production of film and music, *The Brazen Roar*

Saturday, 22nd June 2019 at Kempton Steam Museum, Snakey Lane, Hanworth, TW13 6XH. Over sixty young instrumentalists and singers from Hounslow Music Service joined players from the world-class Philharmonia Orchestra and trumpet soloist Gerard Presencer to perform *The Brazen Roar*, a new musical work composed by Siobhan Lamb. An animated film, supported by Chocolate Films and created by pupils from local school, Bolder Academy accompanied this unique and innovative composition, that resonates with man's relationship with power, choices and change.



"Kempton Steam Museum is immensely proud to host *The Brazen Roar* to celebrate our 90th Anniversary and is a first for us in the field of arts presentation" said Michael Hamilton, Chairman of Kempton Great Engines Trust. Invited guests included the Mayor of Spelthorne and Deputy Mayor of Hounslow as well as Sir Peter Bazalgette, great-great -grandson of the famous Victorian Civil Engineer, Sir Joseph Bazalgette, who was responsible for the design and engineering of a sewer network for central London in mid 1800s. Sir Peter Bazalgette commented "What a wonderful concert! The great engine hissed and then the band played a lovely piece by Siobhan Lamb...there were great parts for all the youthful singers and players."


